To Whom It May Concern:

Before the mobile ultrasonographers came along, we had to send our ultrasound cases to another hospital. This often meant a delay in treatment, and sometimes losing the case to a referral hospital. Having mobile ultrasonographers that were dependable, skilled, and could often come within 24 hours helped us greatly with diagnosing and treating tough cases. The owners loved the fact that they did not have to transport their pets, and the animals could stay with the caretakers they were familiar with. Also, critically ill animals can avoid the stress of being moved. Plus, the owners have already developed a trust in their doctor, and may be reluctant to receive advice from a new doctor. At our clinic, we have found that this service makes us more likely to recommend an ultrasound, and our clients are more likely to acquiesce.

Our clinic has utilized Dr. Marty Henderson's services for several years now. After watching him perform his first few ultrasounds, we were so impressed that he has become our ultrasonographer of choice. He is very thorough and efficient, and his experience allows him to identify many lesions and diseases. Our practice treats dogs, cats and exotics. I am the only exotics vet, and 85-90% of my patients are rabbits. Due to Dr. Henderson's exceptional skills, I asked him to ultrasound my rabbit patients. Watching Dr. Henderson perform cardiac ultrasounds on rabbits, some as small as 2 pounds, has been extremely educational. I am amazed at the amount of detail and information he is able to obtain, especially compared to other ultrasonographers I've utilized in the past. He is always open to questions, and gives valuable treatment advice. Over the past few years, we have examined many rabbit hearts together, and have developed a deep understanding of rabbit heart disease, an illness that is not yet well described in the literature. In one difficult rabbit case, he was able to identify changes in the thorax consistent with pneumonia, and ~~evaluated the heart as normal~~. The diagnosis of pneumonia allowed us to properly treat this rabbit and save her life.

Dr. Marty Henderson is very special. He is kind and caring, skilled and knowledgeable, and one of the best ultrasonographers and veterinarians I've had the pleasure of working with.
